IRS 501c3 Status

If you haven't heard the great news our alumni association has been granted IRS 501c3 tax exempt status. This is a major step forward not only for us a Greek organization but also in our ability to manage relations with Carthage College. With this new status it gives us the ability to do tax deductible fund-raising from people and organizations. While we have some work to do our hope is that now since we've got the same tax advantage as Carthage, that Turtle and Dove alumni will send donations through us so we can have a stronger presence with the College (they do like their money). Of course this means we need to formalize many things that we do including holding an annual meeting of the membership, provide financial reports to the IRS, have an operational board (which is the group you've heard from for a few years) and of course a Board of Trustees which were elected just last fall. If you haven't heard John Felton '86 is our first Board of Trustees President along with Jeff Lindell '92 (Secretary), Mike McBride '82, Kelly Stachnik '92, Casey Griffith '04 and Chad Goeke 12.

TEXAA Association Update

We've come a long way from our humble beginnings as a small service organization in 1953. Died: February 19, 2016

Rev Roy Moore, He was the son of Roy and Susan Moore. He served Lutheran Churches in Romeoville and Peoria, Illinois before coming to Creve Coeur to serve Holy Cross Lutheran Church. In retirement he served as clergy associate at St. Timothy's Episcopal Church.

Throughout his ministry he was involved in the ecumenical community serving various boards and committees. He served on the cabinet of Interfaith Partners for a number of years. He served as chairman of the board of Lutheran Youth Encounter and as president of the Hub Region of Lutheran Student Association of America. He taught a number of bible study classes throughout the community as well as in Illinois and Wisconsin. He wrote much of his teaching material. In Peoria, he worked with the medical community in the area of drug and alcoholic treatment. He was involved in the Cursillo program. He was a hospice chaplain as well as in St. Louis.

He was an avid reader, golfer, gardener, and fisherman. He enjoyed the outdoors as well as interacting with people. He fished in Canada a number of times with friends. Roy was married to Priscilla Mikkelson for 59 years. They have two daughters, Susan Moore Schneider (Dirk Fox) and Patricia Ann Nikolich (Greg). He is also survived by his grandchildren, Matthew Roy Michels, Tyler Nikolich, and Emily Nikolich. Another granddaughter, Clair Schneider died in infancy. Family was always a high priority for him. He and Priscilla spent as much time with their children and grandchildren as possible. 'Family was a gift of God to be treasured,' he often said. Overshadowing his love for family, nature, and the church, was his love for the Lord God whose promise was always before him.
